- 2) How many applicants will you accept a year? Unlimited
- 3) What is the deadline to get applicant packages to you? Recommend minimum of two months prior to the start of the desired semester to allow time for all necessary documents to be received and processed.
- 4) Processing fees for applications are: \$25 for the on-line application. (\$35.00 paper application)
- 5) Upfront fees to Marine freshman are approx: \$125 Orientation fee, \$300 housing deposit, \$25/\$35 application fee (fees are subject to change – visit this link for the latest information: www.lssu.edu/costs).
- 6) Do you participate in the Yellow Ribbon Program? Yes
- 7) Will you cover difference between tuition minus GI Bill and cost of in state "state" school tuition? Or do you want to keep it to in-state residents? We do not cover the difference in tuition between in-state and out-of-state students . In-state tuition will be granted to active duty members of the armed forces if the member is a Michigan resident or is stationed in Michigan.

Spring 2012: Classes begin on Monday, January 9. Orientation will be Friday, January 6, 2012. Students may move into resident halls at that time.

Orientation will be held on various dates throughout the summer with a late session on Wed, August 22. This is the same day new students may move into the resident halls on campus.

- 10) SAT or ACT Scores must not be more than X years old. We do not require ACT/SAT scores for students who have been out-of-high school more than 27 months or who have successfully completed (2.00 or better GPA) more than 19 college credits.
- 11) SAT/ACT mins are: ACT Composite score of 20. SAT of 950 (combined Math and Critical Reading scores).
- 12) Will you recognize AA degree or any college course work? Yes.
Students who have completed prior college coursework need to have earned a cumulative grade point average of 2.00 or higher. An official transcript from all prior colleges/universities attended is required as part of the application process.
- 13) Will you recognize awarding of college credits via alternative means, e.g., DAN TES or CLEP? DAN TES is reviewed by academic departments for determination. LSSU accepts credit for CLEP. Students can view how we grant credit for CLEP at www.lssu.edu/testingservices/clep.
- 14) Are all majors open to Marines? Yes
