Admissions Standards

- Admission to LSSU is based on your grade average from grades 9-12; there are no pre-requisite courses needed to gain entry into the university.
- Canadian students are NOT required to take the ACT test for admission. It is required for students wishing to participate in university athletics and suggested for maximum financial aid consideration.
- Application Process:
 - 1) Complete an application for admission
 - 2) Submit your application fee
 - 3) Provide official transcripts from all secondary schools, colleges, and/or universities attended. Transfer students who have completed more than 19 semester or 29 quarter hours do not need to provide secondary school transcripts.

Paying for your Education

- Lake Superior State University does not assess international student fees or out-of-state tuition to residents of Ontario. Ontario residents pay Michigan resident tuition rates!
- All degree programs are the same tuition rate.
- LSSU accepts Canadian bursaries, including OSAP, and private scholarships.
- LSSU awards scholarships to Ontario students based on their grade average. To qualify for a scholarship, students must apply by March 1 of the Grade 12 year. For students transferring from a college or university, the scholarship deadline is April 15 for the fall semester and December 1 for the spring semester.
- Ontario residents are eligible for employment on campus. There are many work opportunities available for students while they attend LSSU.

Academic Experience

- All Bachelor of Science degrees and Bachelor of Arts degrees are designed to be completed in 4 years.
- An Honors degree may be completed concurrently with acceptance into the Honors Program.

Upon Acceptance

- Upon acceptance to LSSU, students will be issued a Certificate of Eligibility for Non-Immigrant (F-1) Student Status (I-20) allowing for entry into the United States.
- Verification of the ability to pay for tuition, fees, books, and expenses for one academic year is required in order to receive the I-20 form which will lead to F-1 Student Status. Detailed instructions will be sent to students upon their admission to the university.
