You can finish your degree in Escanaba! The required courses for a degree are offered by Lake Superior State University at Bay College.*

When to start?

You can begin with LSSU, if you have earned 64 credits or an associate's degree. It is recommended that you first complete an associate's degree and obtain the MACRAO stamp.

Completing your degree

If you have an associate's degree, you can typically earn a bachelor degree in two or three years by taking two or three classes per semester (including summers).

Classes that fit your schedule

Our classes are to accommodate working students, usually on weeknights or weekends. We also have DVD tape delayed, Interactive TV and on-line classes. A typical night class meets from 6-9 p.m. for 15 weeks. The weekend classes usually meet Friday and Saturdays for just five weekends throughout the semester.

Faculty

Our faculty have a masters degree or Ph. D. in their field. They have classroom and career experience to enhance program instruction. Both full-time and adjunct faculty provide high-quality education to our students.

Academic Resources

Lake Superior State University's Escanaba Regional Center Programs

Accounting

This program covers the development and analysis of data, testing of its validity and interpretation of the results to intended users. Students completing this degree will be eligible to sit for a variety of professional certification examinations. This program complies with current educational requirements for the CPA certification.

Business Administration-Management

Offering a well-rounded professional education for our students. This program provides a broad background in business with a strong foundation in management. Courses include Human Resource Management, Managerial Finance, Business Policy, Organizational Behavior and Business Government and Society.

Business Administration w/ Marketing Minor

A degree designed to introduce students to the many opportunities in the field of marketing. In addition to the professional business core, students will take additional courses to gain the knowledge and skills to understand many areas of marketing.

*Business Administration-Generalist**

This program provides business fundamentals for students to gain more knowledge in many different aspects. Courses include the professional business core, in addition to selecting electives from accounting, business, management or marketing.

Early Childhood Education w/ Sociology or Business Minor

Designed for students interested in working with children from birth to age eight. Students are expected to gain an understanding of the developmental pattern of the young child in such areas as cognition, emotion, social interaction and physical growth. This understanding will be the basis for working with groups of children and will culminate in a practicum. Students choose either a sociology minor or a business minor.

Engineering Management

Focusing on business, management, accounting, economics and automated manufacturing. It provides an opportunity for people with a technical associate degree to obtain a bachelor degree.

Criminal Justice-Corrections w/ Law Enforcement Minor

Courses for this program include criminal justice, correctional casework, juvenile justice and an internship. This degree will benefit students entering or attempting to advance in the corrections field, including probation and parole.

Criminal Justice-Generalist

Designed for students currently working in the field of criminal justice and wanting to obtaining a bachelor's degree to advance. This degree provides credits for academy completion and encourages students to select upper level criminal justice, business or management courses.

Criminal Justice-Law Enforcement

Includes study in loss control, police operations and criminalistics. Students will be required to attend Lake Superior State University's main campus for the Police Academy, their last semester. At the completion of their bachelor degree, the students will have the option of attending the Skills Competition Program for seven weeks. This final segment of the police academy operated by LSSU.

Individualized Studies

A degree that has a flexibility to fit your educational and career goals. Students have the opportunity to customize their degree program, allowing a flexible approach to earning a university degree.

Nursing

Provides the knowledge, values, and skills needed by today's health care professional. Approved by the Michigan Board of Nursing, in addition to being accredited by the National League of Nursing. Courses are scheduled for Wednesdays to help with students who are currently working.
