**Getting Started with Blackboard CE8, Sara Devaprasad:
(Session 3 - LIB 333)**

This session is geared toward new faculty using Blackboard as their course management system. Learn the in's and out's of using Blackboard on campus. A brief introduction to the various features available through Blackboard CE8. This session will be mainly a demonstration.

**Live Lectures – How to Connect to Students (WIMBA), Beth Hronek:
(Session 1 - LIB 333)**

Wimba is a Blackboard based service that allows faculty to teach remote students interactively, or record a session for delayed student access. Through Wimba, the faculty member can use PowerPoint slides, an e-board, graphics and images or software such as Excel, Word, or the web. If you're interested in learning more about Wimba, this is the session for you.

**Assessment--There is Nothing New under the Sun, David Myton:

This session will examine the process of institutionalizing a culture of assessment focused on creating powerful learning environments which effectively promote student learning, higher-order thinking, and life-long achievement as evidenced through authentic assessments utilizing both direct and indirect measures. Topics will include an overview of the Shared Governance Assessment Committee, Assessment at LSSU, Terms and Definitions, and Activities including development of robust and measurable course and program objectives.
