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## May Notes from the Director's Desk

This means students need to make good use of their tutoring time in order to be prepared for their final exams. Things will get very, very busy soon, so we are trying to schedule things as efficiently as possible.

## Other big things in May:

--If you are registering for the June 10<sup>th</sup> ACT, that registration must be submitted to ACT by May 5<sup>th</sup>. If you want to re-take it and you have not used a fee waiver from UB before, you can pick one up and it will allow you to take the test for free. Just call UB to set a pick up time.

--If you are registering for the June 3<sup>rd</sup> SAT, that registration must be submitted to SAT by May 9<sup>th</sup>. You can call the office to see if we have any SAT Fee waivers.... We have requested some but students will need to meet the SAT low income guidelines.

-- If you think you might like to take a Dual Enrollment class next Fall, you need to talk to your Guidance Counselor NOW!!!!

The academic assignment this month is the Summer Session Survey. Many students think they will be getting a job this summer so they don't fill out the survey, then at the last minute they decide they may as well come to UB and are unhappy when we can't fit them in or they don't get their choice of roommates, etc. Fill out the Summer Session Survey and keep us posted on your job hunt. **Juniors and seniors should make sure UB has a copy of their ACT and/or SAT scores. If a senior wants to be considered for the Bridge Summer, you need to let Heidi know FAST. If you wait too long, we won't be able to get you scheduled in a Bridge course.**

<b>1. Anesthesiologist:</b> Responsible for administering the drugs for procedures. Average annual salary: \$269,600 Projected growth (2014 – 2024): 21%	<b>2. Surgeon:</b> Open up people's bodies to correct injuries, diseases or deformities. Average annual salary: \$252,910 Projected growth (2014 – 2024): 19.8%
<b>3. Obstetrician/Gynecologist (OB-GYN):</b> Help maintain women's reproductive health. Average annual salary: \$234,310 Projected growth (2014 – 2024): 17.6%	<b>4. Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeon:</b> Perform surgical procedures pertaining to the face, mouth and jaw. Average annual salary: \$232,870 Projected growth (2014 – 2024): 17.9%
<b>5. Orthodontist:</b> Dentist who specializes in straightening crooked teeth. Average annual salary: \$228,780 Projected growth (2014 – 2024): 18.3%	<b>6. <b>16. Airline pilot, copilot, or flight engineer:</b> Navigate the flight of aircraft. Average annual salary: \$152,770 Projected growth (2014 – 2024): 1.1%	<b>17. Petroleum Engineer:</b> Create new technology to help untap oil Average annual salary: \$147,030 Projected growth (2014 – 2024): 9.8%
<b>18. Computer and information systems manager:</b> Oversee activities in fields such as information systems and computer programming. Average annual salary: \$145,740 Projected growth (2014 – 2024): 15.4%	<b>19. Marketing Manager:</b> Manage all aspects of a company's marketing plan Average annual salary: \$144,140 Projected growth (2014 – 2024): 9.4%

## Career word of the month: Lucrative [loo-kruh-tiv]

**Meaning:** To be profitable, producing a profit, or moneymaking. In other words an item or idea that can create a large volume of income.

**Things to note:** Lucrative was first appeared in the early 15<sup>th</sup> century. Derived from the Old French *lucrative* meaning *profitable* and directly from the Latin word *lucratus* meaning *gainful/profitable*.

**Examples:** When a business is doing well you will probably hear the term lucrative used. For example, Apple had a lucrative year due to a 126% increase in iPhone sales.

**Why I should care:** In the business world when you want to say that you're doing well and bringing in profit you would just use the word lucrative. So the next time you hear lucrative you know that it means a business is bringing in a lot of money.

## May word of the month: Soliloquy [suh-lil-uh-kwee]

**Meaning:** An utterance of speech by a person who is talking to himself or herself or is disregarding of or oblivious to any hearers present. In other words the act of talking while or as if alone.

**Things to note:** Soliloquy first appeared in the 1610s. Steaming from the Late Latin *soliloquium* meaning *a talking to oneself* and the Latin *solus* meaning *alone*. It is said that the Latin root *soliloquium* was first used by Augustine who used it as an analogy of the Greek *monologia* which translates to *monologue*.

**Examples:** Most if not all Shakespeare plays have at least one soliloquy. All of Hamlet's "To be or not to be" is a perfect example. If you have ever watched The Office every individual interview is a soliloquy. Juliet's "O Romeo, Romeo!" is another great example.

**Why I should care:** A soliloquy whether in a book or in a play is a way for the author to express a character's true inner feelings about something. This is where the audience gains a lot of insight about a character.
