

Officials with Lake Superior State University are currently compiling a lengthy document that will determine whether the institution receives reaccreditation from a very important governing body.

Reviewers with the Higher Learning Commission will eventually review the document, known as an Assurance Argument, to ensure LSSU is meeting several criteria established by the federal government. HLC representatives will likely also visit the university next fall.

David Myton, LSSU's associate provost and interim academic dean at large, said the inspectors will then make a recommendation to an HLC board and to an institutional liaison. He added that a final decision on reaccreditation will probably be made in the spring of 2017. LSSU's accreditation periods run for five years.

Federal rules dictate five major criteria for accreditation: mission; ethical and responsible conduct; the quality, resources and support of teaching and learning; the evaluation and improvement of teaching and learning; and resources, planning and institutional effectiveness.

Each criterion is broken into 21 total core components, and LSSU must explain how it is in compliance with each one. The university also has to demonstrate ways in which it can keep improving in those areas.

"We'll be evaluated on whether we address those questions and whether we address them accurately," Myton said.

A six-person team of LSSU officials, including administrators and professors, have been working on the Assurance Argument since the fall of 2013. A final draft has to be submitted to the HLC this fall, and there will be an opportunity for the public to comment. Much of the team's progress is chronicled online at www.lssu.edu/hlc.

The tentative date for the HLC reviewers' on-campus visit is Nov. 7-8. Myton said while they are at LSSU, they will spread out over the campus and meet with students, administrators, and professors while collecting evidence regarding whether the Assurance Argument is factual.

"They'll try to validate that the things we wrote pan out ... We're going to be as open and forthcoming as possible," Myton said. He expressed confidence that the HLC will find strong evidence of progress in all areas.

If any weaknesses are found, the university will have to express how it plans to correct them

HLC accreditation is vital for higher learning institutions because it allows their programs to be



universally recognized, and it allows students to be eligible for financial aid. Myton stressed that HLC accreditation differs from individual program accreditation, which some departments may seek in order to bolster their own credentials.

Myton said the HLC is one of several regional accreditation bodies in the United States. It is the largest, covering 19 total states.







The public is invited to submit written comments that address substantive matters related to the quality of the institution or its academic programs, no later than four weeks prior to the November visit.

"This is an important activity for LSSU and we welcome members of the public to become aware of the process and leave comments if they desire," said David Myton, LSSU associate provost, who is leading the preparation for the accreditation visit. He welcomed the community to review the university's website that is dedicated to the accreditation process www.lssu.edu/hlc.

Most public universities are accredited by nationally or internationally recognized governing bodies. Accreditation is a way to ensure that higher learning institutions are fulfilling their goals and serving their students and communities to the best of their abilities.

The process is voluntary, and it serves as assurance to students that they will receive a quality education when they attend an accredited college or university. It also increases the potential that credits will transfer from one accredited institution to another. LSSU's last accreditation visit was in 2011.


