### **IN THE KNOW– 3rd Grade Reading**



Venessa Keesler, Deputy Superintendent, Division of Educator, Student, and School Supports sent out a memo on May 16th with an update on the Read by Third Grade Retention Guidelines. In 2016, the Michigan legislature passed the "Read by Grade 3 Law." This law requires that students who are more than one year behind grade level in reading are subject to retention and additional support to improve their reading level. This component of the law goes into effect for the 2020-2021 school year. English Language Arts performance is measured by the M-STEP, however, the scores associated with M-STEP performance levels are *Not Proficient, Partially Proficient, Proficient, and Advanced* and do not correlate to a grade level equivalency score meaning a level of "**Not Proficient**" does not necessarily tell if a student is a grade level behind. Because of this, the MDE worked with educators to establish a reading cut score. The cut score was determined through laborious committee work and review and is outlined in the table below.

| RBG3<br>Category | Cut Score         | Response  |
|------------------|-------------------|---|
| 1                | 1252 or<br>lower  | *Subject to retention policy and will be given the resources and supports below |
| 2                | 1253-1271         | Additional reading supports are recommended, not required                       |
| 3                | 1272 or<br>higher | Meets requirement   |

#### NOTE: If a student is in Category 1, the law requires the following:

- Assigned to a highly effective teacher or highest rated or specialist
- Provided evidenced based reading program with proven results
- Receive daily targeted small group of 1-to-1 reading instruction
- Receive ongoing progress monitoring
- Receive supplemental reading instruction
