Senator Gary Peters, *Commencement Speaker*



Senator Gary Peters has represented the State of Michigan in the U.S. Senate since 2015. He has focused on uniting our country by fighting for things we all agree on — a stronger economy, good-paying jobs, affordable health care, a secure retirement and an opportunity for everyone to succeed. In the 117th Congress, Sen. Peters is the Chairman of the Senate Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs Committee, which oversees the Department of Homeland Security and is the Senate's top oversight committee. He also serves on the Senate Armed Services Committee and the Senate Commerce, Science, and Transportation Committee.

In the U.S. Senate, Sen. Peters is recognized as one of the most effective and bipartisan Senators, according to the non-partisan Center for Effective Lawmaking (University of Virginia and Vanderbilt University) and the Lugar

Center (Georgetown University). During the last Congress (2019-2020), Sen. Peters was recognized as the #1 most effective Senator in the U.S. Senate, despite serving as a member of the minority party — an achievement that hadn't been accomplished since the non-partisan Center for Effective Lawmaking began collecting data over 50 years ago. The Center for Effective Lawmaking cited a key to Sen. Peters' success was his effectiveness in coalition-building. In those two years, Sen. Peters was the principal sponsor and author of more stand-alone bills signed into law than any Democratic or Republican member serving in either the Senate or House. Some of his bills signed into law include: increasing protections for the Great Lakes and securing historic funding for restoration efforts, increasing our nation's security at our borders, addressing rising water levels and shoreline erosion in Great Lakes communities, expanding apprenticeships for veterans, improving the VA Caregivers Program and saving taxpayer dollars.

Among his latest efforts, Sen. Peters announced the U.S. Coast Guard Great Lakes Center of Expertise will be headquartered in Michigan at Lake Superior State University. The Center of Expertise, which Sen. Peters established through legislation he enacted into law in 2018, will examine the impacts of oil spills in freshwater environments and develop effective responses to quickly address a potential oil spill in the Great Lakes. This work will be critical in protecting the Great Lakes, as current oil spill response technologies are primarily designed for saltwater environments. Sen. Peters also helped pass the bipartisan infrastructure law which included \$479 million to invest in modernizing the Soo Locks. With this

investment, there is now enough funding to finish building a new lock and get the lock up-and-running earlier than expected. This funding will also make much-needed upgrades to the existing Soo Locks to ensure they can continue serving as a vital gateway for Great Lakes freighters carrying raw goods to manufacturers nationwide, bolstering commerce on the Great Lakes. Sen. Peters recently passed his historic, bipartisan Postal Service Reform Act into law, putting the United States Postal Service on a more sustainable financial footing to ensure it can continue providing reliable service to Americans for years to come.

Sen. Peters is a product of Michigan schools. After graduating from Rochester High School, he attended Alma College, where he earned a B.A. in Political Science. While working a full-time job, he went on to earn an M.B.A. in Finance from the University of Detroit Mercy, an M.A. in political science from Wayne State University, an M.A. in Philosophy from Michigan State University with a focus on the ethics of development and a law degree (J.D.) from Wayne State University Law School. He also earned a diploma from the College of Naval Command and Staff, U.S. Naval War College. Previously, Sen. Peters worked in the private sector for over 20 years as a financial advisor.

Sen. Peters volunteered for the U.S. Navy Reserve at age 34, where he earned a Seabee Combat Warfare Specialist designation and rose to the rank of Lieutenant Commander. After the September 11th terrorist attacks on our country, he volunteered again for drilling status and served overseas as part of his Reserve duty.

Senator Peters has lived his entire life in Michigan, and he and his wife, Colleen, have three children.

Kirk Allen Smallegan, *Graduating Student Speaker*



Kirk Smallegan, a native of McBain, Michigan, graduates Magna Cum Laude with a Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree. Mr. Smallegan is confident that his LSSU education and clinical experiences at LSSU have prepared him well for his new position at Munson Medical Center as a Registered Nurse in a Critical Care Unit.

While attending LSSU, Mr. Smallegan completed evidence-based practice research on "The Effects of Alarm Fatigue on Critical Care Nurses," as well as a project focusing on hand hygiene in hospitals. Mr. Smallegan is "thankful to LSSU's nursing faculty and to the clinical organizations for the quality of instruction and opportunities received, and for all the knowledge and skills acquired throughout these past 4 years." Through his work in those community clinical organizations, Mr. Smallegan and his classmates are to be

commended for a successful collaboration on his outstanding Senior Year Community Assessment project to assist in the design and implementation of a new Veteran's Adult Foster Care Home for Superior Health Support Systems in Sault Ste. Marie, Michigan.

In addition to his academic achievements, Mr. Smallegan actively served LSSU and its students. As a member of the Lake Superior Student Nursing Association (LSSNA), he was a member of the Executive Board for three years. During his tenure with LSSNA, he organized several blood drives and coordinated the Association's team for the Relay for Life events. His volunteer work through LSSNA included fundraising across the University community to support various groups and raise money for local charities, including the Hospice House and the Diane Peppler Resource Center. "LSSNA afforded me opportunities to collaborate with nursing students in all levels of the program, enabling me to learn from the upperclassmen when I was new to the program, and giving me the chance to mentor, support, and connect with underclassmen when I had progressed further in the program." Outside the Nursing program, Mr. Smallegan served LSSU and its students in the Academic Success Center as a student tutor for Anatomy and Physiology and as a Supplemental Instructor (SI) for Nurse 327 Adult Nursing I.

Mr. Smallegan's achievements also include earning the LSSU Academic Excellence Scholarship, the Tempie Dubow Award, the Robert & Patricia Pfaff Scholarship, and the LSSU Endowed Award while attending LSSU, and he gratefully acknowledges the contribution

these awards have made to his successful completion of his Nursing degree. In addition, Mr. Smallegan was inducted into the Sigma Theta Tau International Nursing Honor Society in recognition of his academic achievements.

Mr. Smallegan has been an active and productive member of LSSU's community over the past four years. He explains, "After attending a small high school with a graduating cohort of only 22 students, LSSU was a perfect fit for me. I felt comfortable here from the moment I stepped on campus." He was very active with the "His House" Christian ministry group, and served as a member of the group's worship team for three years, and as its leader for two of those years. Mr. Smallegan also enjoyed participating in intramural sports, including broomball, soccer, and volleyball.

Off campus, Mr. Smallegan worked at Munson Medical Center as a Nursing Assistant during the summer months. He also spent a semester working at Great Lakes Allergy and Asthma Center as a medical assistant. Both experiences gave him abundant opportunities to apply what he had learned in LSSU's Nursing program, allowing him to put his nursing skills into practice and to provide therapeutic patient care.

Mr. Smallegan is the son of Rich and Pam Smallegan, brother to LSSU Nursing program alumnus Kiffin Smallegan, and brother to Kendrick Smallegan. He is grateful for the support of his fiancée and family throughout his time at LSSU, and together with his fiancée, Kiya Grundy, he is eager to start his new career as a Registered Nurse in a Critical Care Unit at Munson Medical Center.

Musicians

Native American drummers have been a part of our commencement ceremony since 1997, sending out our graduates with an Honor Song. This year, we are proud to welcome Aabizii of Brimley, Michigan. Honor Songs are described as being "given to us so we could honor each other as brothers and sisters and to honor all of creation. The spirit of the drum is for the people, the heartbeat of Mother Earth, and a gift from the Creator. These songs lend us support and help us get through trying times."

Commencement Marshal

The marshal, who leads and directs the ceremony, is the recipient of the previous year's Distinguished Teaching Award. The marshal this year is Dr. Cathy White, Associate Professor in the School of Education. She bears the ceremonial sash and the university mace that serve as symbols of authority.

Academic Attire

The use of academic dress stems from costumes used in universities of the 14th and 15th centuries, particularly at Oxford and Cambridge in England. Used in the United States from colonial times, the regalia was standardized by an intercollegiate code in 1895.

Three types of gowns are indicated by the code. The baccalaureate gown has long pointed sleeves. Our baccalaureate graduates wear blue gowns. The gold version of this gown is worn by associate degree recipients. The master's gown has long, closed sleeves with the arc of a circle near the bottom. They are garbed in black. The doctoral gown has full bell-shaped sleeves with three velvet bars and velvet panels down the center front of the gown.

Hoods vary in size and shape. They are lined in the official academic colors of the institution conferring the degree. A chevron is used to introduce a second color. Colored velvet trims the hood and indicates the subject to which the degree pertains.

The University president wears a large medallion donned only on ceremonial occasions. That medallion, cast in bronze, is inscribed with the founding date of the University, its name, and the state seal.

At Lake Superior State University, it is customary to identify the candidates graduating by tassels of the official color appropriate to the subject of study. Degree candidates wear the tassel on the right side of the cap until the degree is conferred.
