

STUDENT OPPORTUNITIES

CHARTER SCHOOL GUARANTEE

LSSU offers the Charter School Guarantee that allows Michigan high school seniors graduating from an Academy authorized by LSSU guaranteed admission to the university. Upon enrollment, the student will automatically receive a \$2,000 scholarship renewable for up to four years, per remaining in good standing.

DUAL ENROLLMENT

LSSU offers dual and concurrent enrollment opportunities for high school students to earn university credits while still in high school. Students are able to get a jump start on earning their college degree.

EARLY COLLEGE

The Eastern Upper Peninsula Early College Program is a partnership between LSSU and local school districts of the Eastern Upper Peninsula Intermediate School District. The five year high school program allows a student to earn a high school diploma and college credits leading up to an Associate's degree from LSSU or a Michigan Early/Middle College Association Technical Certificate.


S.T.E.A.M. CAMP

LSSU CSO coordinates a variety of science, technology, engineering, arts, and music camp opportunities. These camps are dedicated to providing unique and potentially life changing experiences for LSSU charter school students.

SUMMER CAMPS

The Charter Schools Office coordinates with the LSSU Admissions Department to offer camp experiences for charter school students that include a visit to the Center for Freshwater Research, participation in programs offered through the Fine Arts Center, the Superior Simulation Center, and the Robotics Lab. We believe in the importance of well rounded students.








COLLEGE READINESS






