Bachelor of Science Teacher Education- 3-6

The Elementary Teacher Preparation program is highlighted by the interaction of content knowledge and pedagogical skills in effective teaching. Students will engage in clinical experiences throughout the program as they plan, deliver, and reflect on learning activities with children at the 3rd-6th grade levels. Graduates are equipped to teach all content areas equally (literacy, mathematics, science, and social studies) to students in grades 3-6 in a self-contained classroom or departmentalized setting. Coursework is driven by standards that include developmentally appropriate instructional practices for students in grades 3-6 with an emphasis on learner-centered supports. Students can also opt to add a Learning Disabilities special education endorsement.

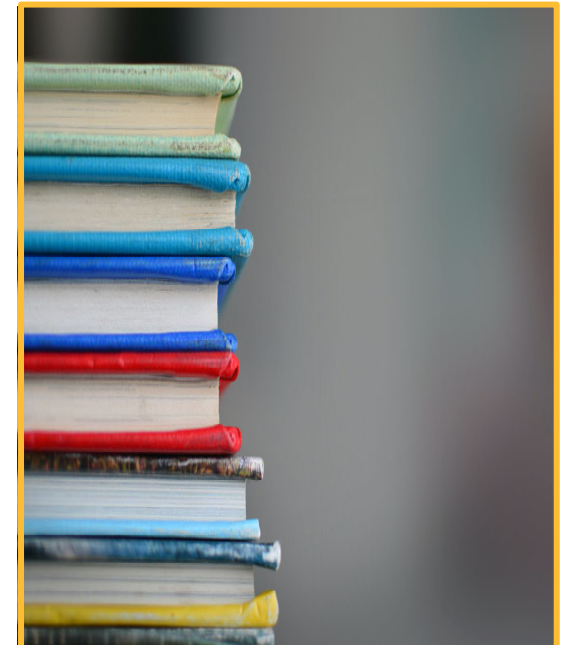
