## **Background:**

- 1. LSSU
  - Recently hired Maggie Corbett as Head Athletic Trainer.
  - Recent LSSU Athletic Trainers (AT).
    - Maggie Corbett (Head AT 2023-pres.)
    - Becky Nason (Head AT 2020-23)
    - Claire Meyer (Assistant AT 2022-23)
    - Meagan Briant (Assistant AT 2021-22)

    - Natalie Reynods (AT 2017-19)
    - John Teasley (AT 2017-19)
  - Corbett marks the seventh athletic trainer at LSSU in the past five years
  - Joe Susi, Dept. Chair of the School of Kinesiology and Behavioral Sciences, volunteered to ensure that fall sports could practice while the newest A.T. was being selected.

#### 2. NCAA

- Collegiate athletics has realized 48% turnover rate in the past two years, almost twice as high when compared to the corporate and higher-education two-year turnover rate.
- According to a survey disseminated by the National Athletic Trainers Association Intercollegiate Council for Sports Medicine in collaboration with the NATA Compensation Task Force, salary, culture, value, burnout, increased work responsibilities and demands were major themes that came out as a result.
- The AT marketplace is becoming more competitive as other professional settings, such as hospitals, sports medicine clinics, industrial settings, physician offices,

and medical sales may offer signing bonuses, along with competitive market rate salaries and flexible scheduling.

- Collegiate environments who are slow to respond to these changes will continue to have challenges hiring and retaining athletic trainers.
