

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE TEACHER EDUCATION - 3-6 GRADE

The Elementary Teacher Preparation program emphasizes the integration of content knowledge and pedagogical skill to promote effective teaching. Throughout the program, students participate in clinical experiences where they plan, deliver, and reflect on instruction for children in grades 3-6. Graduates are equipped to teach all core subjects—literacy, math, science, and social studies—in both self-contained and departmentalized classroom settings. The curriculum is grounded in standards-based, developmentally appropriate instructional practices, with a strong focus on learner-centered supports for learners in 3-6 grades. Students have the option to pursue a Learning Disabilities special education endorsement to expand their teaching credentials.

The Educator Preparation Programs are accredited by the Inquiry Brief Commission of the Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation (CAEP).
