Graduates are equipped to focus on whole child development, special education, relationships, and content area knowledge and pedagogy. Foundational and content area coursework are driven by program standards that include developmentally appropriate instructional practices for children in Birth-Kindergarten settings.

The Educator Preparation Programs are accredited by the Inquiry Brief Commission of the Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation (CAEP).
