

BACHELOR OF ARTS/SCIENCE GENERAL STUDIES

The General Studies BA/BS allows students to design a personalized degree by selecting two minors, two concentrations, or one of each from distinct academic areas. With guidance from the general studies coordinator and advisors in both fields, students craft a program that highlights their unique strengths and interests across disciplines.

The synthesis of knowledge from more than one area of study enables the student to become an effective contributor in their community and a world in which careers are increasingly complex and varied in their requirements. The value of this model is showcased in a required capstone project, where students integrate their learning into a practical, academically rigorous research project.

Note: To complete this degree, LSSU courses must be available through the regional center or online in each chosen area of study.

General Education Requirements

Students are encouraged to complete the Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA) at Bay College. Successfully completing the MTA transfers general education courses as a block, fulfilling LSSU's general education requirements.

LSSU's general education core requirements (minimum 34 total credits):

- Oral and Written Communication (min. 9 cr)
 - ENGL110 (Bay's ENGL101)
 - ENGL111 (Bay's ENGL102)
 - COMM (Bay's COMM103 or 104)
- Mathematics (min. 3 cr)
 - MATH110 (Bay's MATH107) or higher
- Social Science (min. 6 cr)
- Natural Science (min. 7 cr)
- Humanities (min. 6 cr)
- Cultural Diversity (min. 3 cr)

Bachelor of Arts Degree

One year of a modern language other than English. One-half year of two different languages will not meet this requirement.

Degree Requirements

- Minimum 124 total credits (100-level or higher)
- At least 50% of 300/400 level credits from LSSU
- At least 30 credits from LSSU to satisfy residency
- Overall GPA of 2.0 or above
- Minimum 2.0 GPA in individual minors/ concentrations, major, and general education requirements

Major Requirements

Complete two academic minors, or two academic concentrations, or one of each. No more than two (2) courses may be counted in common to meet the minimum requirements for minors, concentrations, or between minor and concentration.

Minors: Successfully complete academic minor(s) totaling at least 30 credits each. At least 10 credits in each minor must be LSSU credits. Complete additional courses in the same course prefixes used in the minor in cases where the minor does not meet the minimum of 30 credits. Minors available at the Regional Center:

Concentrations: Complete at least 30 credits in defined academic concentrations. Concentrations must include at least 10 credits in LSSU credits, and at least 12 credits must be at the 300/400 level. Concentrations available at the Regional Center:
