The Elementary Teacher Preparation program is highlighted by the interaction of content knowledge and pedagogical skills in effective teaching. Students will engage in clinical experiences throughout the program as they plan, deliver, and reflect on learning activities with children at the Pre-Kindergarten - 3 grade levels. Graduates are equipped to teach literacy, mathematics, science, and social studies to students in a self-contained classroom or departmentalized setting. The standards for the PK-3 grade program include integration and instruction to meet the needs of the whole child, leading to a well-rounded education. Students can also opt to add a Learning Disabilities special education endorsement.

The Educator Preparation Programs are accredited by the Inquiry Brief Commission of the Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation (CAEP).
