Graduates combine program outcomes and learning standards and are prepared to teach both PK-3 and 3-6 grade bands, with a focus on developmentally appropriate instruction across literacy, math, science, and social studies. The program emphasizes whole-child learning and offers the option to add a Learning Disabilities endorsement in special education.

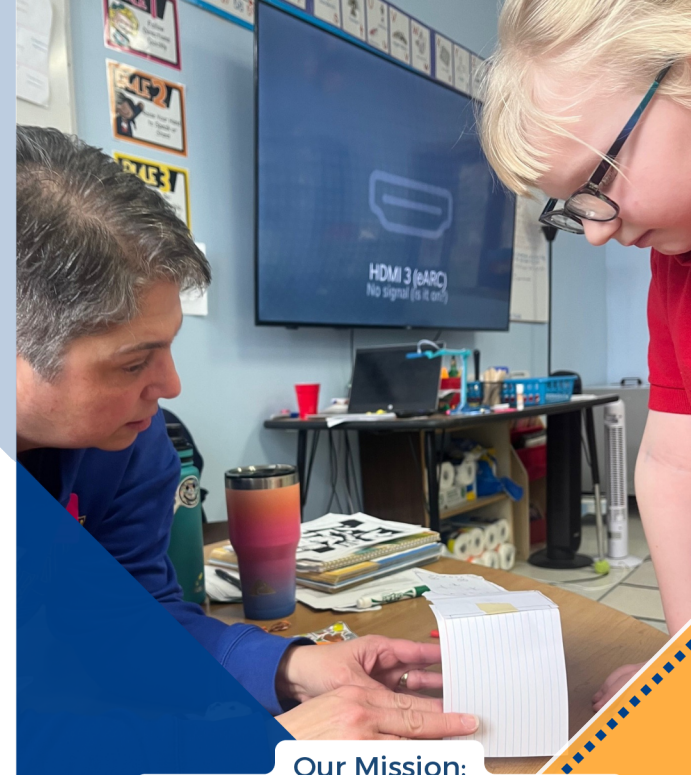
