

STUDENT OPPORTUNITIES



CHARTER SCHOOL GUARANTEE

Lake Superior State University extends the Charter School Guarantee to Michigan high school seniors graduating from academies authorized by LSSU. This program ensures guaranteed admission to the university. Upon enrollment, eligible students will be awarded a scholarship, renewable annually for up to four years, contingent upon maintaining satisfactory academic standing.

DUAL ENROLLMENT

Lake Superior State University offers dual and concurrent enrollment opportunities that allow high school students to earn university credits while completing their high school studies. These programs enable students to begin their college education early and make meaningful progress toward their degree.

EARLY COLLEGE

The Eastern Upper Peninsula Early College Program is a collaborative partnership between Lake Superior State University and the local school districts within the Eastern Upper Peninsula Intermediate School District. This five-year high school program enables students to earn both a high school diploma and college credits leading toward an Associate's degree from LSSU or a Michigan Early/Middle College Association Technical Certificate.

S.T.E.A.M. CAMP

The Lake Superior State University Charter Schools Office coordinates a variety of science, technology, engineering, arts, and music camps designed to engage and inspire students. These programs provide unique and potentially life-changing experiences for students enrolled in LSSU- authorized charter schools.

SUMMER CAMPS

The Lake Superior State University Charter Schools Office collaborates with the LSSU Admissions Department to offer a variety of camp experiences for students enrolled in LSSU-authorized charter schools. These initiatives are designed to promote personal growth and academic enrichment, fostering the development of well-rounded students.




COHORT VS NON-COHORT

Students who have been continuously enrolled for 3 or more years


Non-Cohort Students:

NWEA: Cohort vs. Non-Cohort Students


% Meeting Mathematics Targets




% Meeting Reading Targets

Percent of non-cohort student tests meeting both mathematics and reading targets:








COLLEGE READINESS

Cohort vs. Non-Cohort Students


